



Permanent Makeup Healing Schedule Lips

Lips Day & Effect

Day 1:

Swelling, tenderness, heavy, thick lipstick appearance with a reddish black color affect. It will be very bold in color. Use cold compresses – frozen peas to bring down the swelling and help with any discomfort. Put a balm/Vaseline/Aquaphor on to keep moist.

Day 2:

Slight swelling, reddish and tender with a slight metallic flavor. Again, use cold compresses, balm/Vaseline/Aquaphor for moisture.

Day 3:

Less swelling, thicker texture, sore, hot feeling before exfoliation with an orange color affect.

Day 4:

Exfoliation may begin, very chapped lips. Use balm/Vaseline/Aquaphor day and night. DO NOT PICK!

Day 5:

Very chapped but almost finished with first chapping stage. Keep moist.

Day 6:

A soft, rich color begins to appear.

Day 7 – 13:

Lip color disappears and looks “frosty” (2nd chapping stage) – stage begins as a whitish/grayish haze on lips. Keep moist and DO NOT PICK.

Day 14:

Color “blooms” from within more and more each day until approximately day 21 (3 weeks post procedure).

Day 21:

Healing should be complete/or almost complete; the color you see is the color you have. Your lips will remain a bit dry for a month or possibly two. Use a good lip balm and they will return to normal but with full color.
